Part 1: My Life Before Christ

This section helps you explain why you needed Jesus. You do not need to impress anyone or glorify sin. Be honest, be brief, and help people understand what life was like before you trusted Christ.



Questions to help you think

- What did I rely on for hope, identity, or direction?

- What was missing spiritually?

- What fears, guilt, confusion, or emptiness marked that season?

- Was I religious without truly knowing Christ?

- What helped me realize I needed Jesus?

Helpful Guidelines



- Be honest
- Be brief
- Do not glorify sin
- Do not shock people for attention

Part 2: How I Came to Know Christ

This is the heart of your testimony. Explain clearly how you came to understand the gospel and personally trusted Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.

Questions to help you think

- ? Who shared the gospel with me?

- ? Where was I when God was working in my heart?

- ? What did I understand about my sin?

- ? What did I understand about Jesus, the cross, and His grace?

- ? When did I personally place my faith in Christ?

- ? How did I respond?



Important Reminder

Salvation is not the same as joining a church, getting baptized, or becoming more religious. This section should explain when and how you personally trusted Christ.

Part 3: My Life Since Christ

Salvation does not mean a perfect life. It means new life, new direction, and ongoing growth in Jesus. This section helps you explain what Christ has changed and how He continues to work in your life.

Questions to help you think

- What new desires has God given me?

- How has Jesus given me peace, purpose, or strength?

- How has He been faithful to me over time?
